Maths	In Maths, Year 4 will be developing their knowledge of fractions and decimals A great way to develop your knowledge
	around these topics is to use the Maths is Fun website: www.mathsisfun.com

	multiplying and dividing by 10 and 10.
	Use TTRockstars to practice recalling all multiplication facts at speed.
Science	Our Science focus, this half term, is <b>States of Matter</b> .
	In this unit, we will compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.
	We will also observe how materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure or research the
	temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C)
	We will also identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associate the rate of
	evaporation with temperature.
RE	In RE this half term, we will be learning about Salvation.

	control an on-screen turtle, to create mathematical patterns. They will also develop their ability to compose algorithms for
<u></u>	drawing mathematical structures and turn these into Logo code.
Topic	Our Heritage Topic is <u>Our Passions</u> and our subject focus is <u>History</u> .
	In Year 4, we will be learning all about the Roman Civilisation.
