At St Matthews, we are grateful to God for sending his son and we are also grateful for our wonderful parents, carers, teachers and children, who have worked so hard throughout this term.

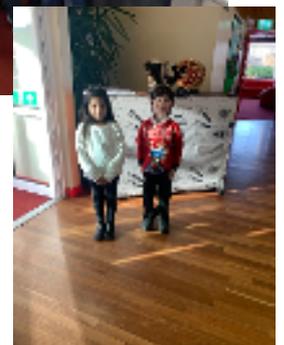
We really appreciate the great community we are and want to wish you a peaceful and blessed holiday.
